The cemetery is located in Archer Township. Travel east from Cadiz toward Steubenville on US Route 22, for 1 ½ miles. Then turn left onto Bakers Ridge Road and continue for ½ mile. Turn Left onto Mattern Road and continue for one tenth mile. Cemetery is on the Left.

SHADRACK TIPTON (lived in and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

<u>BORN:</u> 1754 (a) Maryland <u>SON OF:</u> Edward and Jemima (Murray) Tipton (b) <u>DIED:</u> 16 September 1822, Harrison County (b) <u>AGE:</u> 68 years (c) <u>BURIED:</u> Mattern Cemetery, Archer Township, Harrison County, Ohio <u>MARKER:</u> Yes (c) but dirt piled across the road entrance prevented our check. <u>MARRIED:</u> Yes, twice. Details unknown (b)

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania

- Specific: He served under Capt. Paxton in Raxton's Ranger Company at Bedford, Pennsylvania, from 12 September 1776 to November 1776, a total of 58 days. (d).
- **RESIDED:** Shadrack was born in Pennsylvania. He served in the army at Bedford, Pa. After the war he bought land in Warrior Mark Township in Pa. In 1815 he sold his Pennsylvania property and moved to Archer Township, Harrison County, Ohio, bought a farm, and lived there until he died. (e)
- <u>WIVES:</u> #1 Drucilla (maiden name unknown) #2 Elizabeth (maiden name unknown) (b) No information known at this time about their birth, death, or burial.

- 1) Edmond Tipton (ca 1780-1864) married Elizabeth McCabe (b)
- 2) Nancy (1784-1865) married John Mattern (1777-1861) (f)
- 3) William (1791-1866) Smithfield, Oh. married Catherine Weston (1789-1842) (g)
- 4) Susanna married (1825) Jesse Smith (h)

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: Shadrack Tipton was a Methodist minister. He helped build the Warrior Mark Township, Huntingdon, Pennsylvania. He was involved with the Methodist Church after he came to Ohio.
