THOMAS MINOR (lived in Virginia and Jefferson County, Ohio, where he died and is buried.)

BORN: 1761 Virginia (a)

SON OF: unknown

DIED: 1840 Jefferson County, Ohio. (b)

AGE: 79 years (c)

BURIED: Richmond United Presbyterian Cemetery, Richmond, Jefferson County, Ohio.

MARKER: Yes

MARRIED: Yes, 14 March 1781 Virginia (a)

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private in the 7th Virginia Regiment (d)

Specific: Thomas Minor enlisted in 1776 and was discharged in 1777 from the 7th Regiment of the Virginia Continental Line. (e) He received a pension for his military service starting on 4 September 1824 when he was seventy three years old. (f)

RESIDED: He lived in Loudoun County, Virginia, until the end of the war. Then, he moved to Jefferson County, Ohio. (g)

SPOUSE: ANN JENNINGS (referred to as both Ann and Nancy)

BORN: 1762 Cameron Township, Loudoun County, Virginia (g)

DIED: 1843 Jefferson County, Ohio (g)

BURIED: Richmond United Presbyterian Cemetery, Richmond, Jefferson County, Ohio. (g)

MARKER: no readable marker found
