While these specific pages cannot be used as actual proof of Revolutionary War service, it can be very helpful as a guide. The reference section for each Patriot contains all of the sources used to validate the information presented on this webpage and would be invaluable on a membership application for the Sons or Daughters of the American Revolution.

The cemetery is located in German Township, Take CR4 (Miller Station Rd.) from SR 22 at Hopedale. It is about 5 1/2 miles to the cemetery. It is on the left side of the road. From the north it is about 1/2 mile from SR 646 on Miller Station Road.

JOHN ADAM SAWVEL (lived and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

BORN: 1750 York County, Pennsylvania (e)

SON OF: unknown

DIED: 1826 Harrison County, Ohio (a)

AGE: 76 years (b)

BURIED: Zion Cemetery, German Township, Harrison County, Ohio (b)

MARKER: Yes

MARRIED: Yes, exact date unknown

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania Militia (c)

Specific: He was in the Bucks County, Pennsylvania, Militia. The only official record that has been located so far

indicates that he entered the militia in 1783 and continued with it after the Paris Treaty of Peace was

signed in September of 1783. (c)

RESIDED: Born in York County, Pennsylvania, he lived in Bucks County before coming to Ohio. He relocated to Ohio in 1815 and lived on a farm in Rumley Township where he died. (d)

WIFE: ANNA CATHERINA ANGEL (maiden name unknown) (a)

BORN: 1764

<u>DIED:</u> 1826 Rumley Township, Harrison County, Ohio (a & d) BURIED: Zion Cemetery, German Township, Harrison Co, Oh.

MARKER: Yes

<u>MORE OF HIS HISTORY:</u> Adam was a farmer. Several of his descendants continue to live in eastern Ohio. New grave markers for him and his wife were dedicated in the fall of 1998.

BORN: 16 March 1752 in Germany (a)

SON OF: unknown

<u>DIED:</u> 6 October 1827 German Township, Harrison County, Ohio. (a)

AGE: 75 years (b)

BURIED: Old Zion Cemetery, German Township, Harrison County, Ohio. (a)

MARKER: no (c)

MARRIED: date not known

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania Militia

Specific: Private Shultz served three years and five months. (a) He was a Private in Captain Peter Nagle's Company,

4th Battalion, Berks County, Pennsylvania Militia (d)

RESIDED: He was born in Germany but the location is not known at this time. Apparently, he lived in Berks County, Pennsylvania. He is known to have lived in German Township. However, he did not take an original patent for land and the exact location of his home needs more research.

WIFE: ELIZABETH SHOEMAKER (a)
