General: Private Maryland Flying Camp Militia (f)

Specific: George enlisted in 1776 as a private in Capt. John Ogilvie's Company. He was in the Flying Camp Company

in 1783 (b, f)

RESIDED: Born in Cecil County, Maryland, he appears on the Steubenville Township, Jefferson County, Ohio tax list in

1806 and 1807. From 1808 to 1810 he is on the Cross Creek Township, Jefferson County, tax lists. (h) His

name appears on the 1820 and 1830 Cross Creek Township census lists. (i)

SPOUSE: (b) SARAH CATHERINE RODGERS

Born: unknown DIED: 1826

BURIED: Cross Creek Cemetery, Jefferson County, Ohio.

MARKER: none found

CHILDREN: Children not known at this time.

The George Day for whom there is a will probated 8 May 1849 in Cross Creek Township is probably a son.

General: Private in the Virginia Continental Army (b, c)

Specific: William McElroy was a Private in the 9th and 13th Regiments of the Virginia Continental Lines. (b, c) The

13th Virginia Regiment and the Pennsylvania 8th Regiment were the ones that served Fort Lauren. His name does not appear on the current list of those men stationed there. Only a small number of the

regiment soldiers were actually stationed there.
