1792. His rank was that of major when he left the service. (b & d)

<u>RESIDED:</u> Born in Princeton, New Jersey. His service was with Pennsylvania units. After the war he lived and died in

Jefferson County, Ohio.

Specific: Originally Philip Cable was an ensign in the second company of the first battalion under Col William Parker. (e) Philip Cable was a captain for the eighth company, third battalion of the Bedford County militia under Lt. Col. Bernard Dougherty and John Woods. (f)

RESIDED: Philip was in Bedford County, Pennsylvania during the War. At some time he moved to Jefferson County, Ohio, and appears on the tax records for Steubenville Township in 1806 through 1810. (g) He died in Jefferson County and apparently was buried in the Cable burying ground near Steubenville. If this information is correct, he was later moved to Union Cemetery in Steubenville. (d)

<u>RESIDED:</u> He is reported to have been born in Amsterdam, Holland. He was a merchant in Lisbon, Portugal. Following

the war he came to the United States, lived, and died in Jefferson County, Ohio. (d)

MORE OF THE HISTORY: Arnold's funds were so depleted that the Congress granted him a salary as an agent of the United States and also gave him land in what is now Ohio. He was given twp.13, R. 7 consisting of 23,040 acres and six miles square. The land was the western three fifths of Franklin Township including the dam and western part of Tappan Lake and the three southwestern sections and three half sections in Monroe Twp., Harrison Co. and nine sections in Mill Twp including a small part of Dennison and six sections in Rush Twp., including Stillwater in Tuscarawas County. MORE OF HIS HISTORY: Bounty Warrants, Revolutionary Soldiers, State Librarian, Richmond, VA Continental Line. Auditor's Account of VA, 1780: John was one of the early settlers of Jefferson County, OH. He was an only son of Baron Ludwig Von Fisher. John came to this country with his father at an early age and they located in Germanna, VA, not far from Winchester, VA. He married Susannah Bratton, the daughter of Col. James Bratton of Winchester, VA. John's father died 1777 in Madison County, VA. After John served in the Revolutionary War, he came to Jefferson County, OH. John started a pottery manufacturing business shortly after settling in Steubenville, OH in 1806. A few years after starting this business John died and his son took over the business. From John there were many descendants and many of them have gone in to the DAR on his patriotic service. (k)

Line. (c) He was appointed as a surgeon's mate in the Sixth Pennsylvania Battalion under Col. William Irvine on 9 January 1776. (d) Apparently, he continued as a surgeon throughout the war. He was a

member of the Society of Cincinnati and received a sword for his distinguished service. (f)

RESIDED: He lived and served in the American Revolution as a resident of the State of Pennsylvania. After the war he

moved to Jefferson County, Ohio. (a, c, d)

AGE: 95 years in 1833 (c)

BURIED: Union Cemetery in Steubenville, Ohio

MARKER: Yes, military marker

MARRIED: It is not known if he was married or not.

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania Militia (b, c)

Specific: Abraham Moore enlisted in the Pennsylvania Militia in 1781. (c) At one time he served as a substitute

for Augustus Moore with whom he lived. (a) He received a pension for his Revolutionary War Service

that started on 4 March 1831 when he was 95 years old. (c)

RESIDED: Abraham Moore was born in Maryland. (b) He was living in what is now Fayette County, Pennsylvania, when he enlisted in 1781. He was living with Augustus Moore. The relationship between Abraham and Augustus Moore is not known. After the Revolution he lived in Washington County, Pennsylvania, until about 1796 when he moved to Jefferson County, Ohio, where he lived until he died. (b) He lived in or near Steubenville. (a)

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: One of the earliest settlers to move here (Steubenville) with his family was Matthew Myers who came from Washington Co, Pennsylvania, about the year 1800. His wife was Eve Figley also of Pennsylvania. They took up a large tract of land on the hills back of the town and it is said that on the day of their arrival while their goods were being unpacked, a small group of friendly Indians unexpectedly made their appearance and frightened the children to such an extent that the family almost decided to go back to Pennsylvania.
