Revolutionary War Soldiers Buried in Rock Hill Cemetery

While these specific pages cannot be used as actual proof of Revolutionary War service, it can be very helpful as a guide. The reference section for each Patriot contains all of the sources used to validate the information presented on this webpage and would be invaluable on a membership application for the Sons or Daughters of the American Revolution.

The cemetery is located in Flushing Township. Take State Route 331 out of the town of Flushing toward Holloway for 1.6 miles. Then turn left on to County Road 74 and proceed 0.7 miles to the intersection with County Road 72. Turn left at that intersection and proceed 200 yards. The church and cemetery will be on the right.

- **Specific:** Captain William Kirk served in the Eighth Company of the Sixth Battalion of the Chester County militia commanded by Lt. Col. Caleb Davis. (b)
- **<u>RESIDED:</u>** William Kirk was born, served in the Revolution, was married, and five of their children were born while living in Chester County, Pennsylvania. Robert was born in Chester County in 1797. His sister, Phebe, was born in 1799 in Fayette County, Pa. After March of 1805 he moved to Flushing Township, Belmont County, Ohio, and lived there until he died. (a)
