
While these specific pages cannot be used as actual proof of Revolutionary War service, it can be very helpful as a guide. The reference section for each Patriot contains all of the sources used to validate the information presented on this webpage and would be invaluable on a membership application for the Sons or Daughters of the American Revolution.

The cemetery is located at comer of Ohio and South Streets. The only original military marker is for James Rankin. The Moravian Trail Chapter of the DAR has placed a memorial marker with the names of eight Revolutionary War men. Two markers have been placed recently. No markers for Thomas Haley, Samuel Maholm, and Jacob Meachem.

BORN: 1754(b) <u>SON OF:</u> unknown <u>DIED:</u> 10 September 1832 (a) <u>AGE:</u> 78 years (a) <u>BURIED:</u> Old Cadiz Cemetery (a) <u>MARKER:</u> Moravian Trail Chapter of DAR Memorial in the Old Cadiz Cemetery <u>MARRIED:</u> Marriage date not known

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private, Pennsylvania Militia 1782-1784

- **Specific:** Joseph was a member of Eleazer Williamson's Company under Lieutenant William Williamson of the Third Battalion in Washington Co., Pa., Militia (c)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: During the Revolutionary War Alexander lived in Washington County, Pennsylvania. He and his family moved to what became Harrison County, Ohio, after 1800.

BORN: In the decade 1760-1770 (a) <u>SON OF:</u> unknown <u>DIED:</u> In the decade 1840-1850) (b) <u>AGE:</u> unknown <u>BURIED:</u> Old Cadiz Cemetery, Cadiz, Ohio. (c) <u>MARKER:</u> Moravian Trail Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution Memorial <u>MARRIED:</u> unknown

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania militia (e)

Specific: Private of the Second Company, Third Battalion of Militia under Lt Col. John Shee. (e) He appears on the 1840 pensioner's census living in Cadiz, Ohio. (f)

<u>RESIDED</u>: William Boggs was living in Short Creek Township, Harrison County, Ohio, in 1830 (a). He was living in Cadiz Village, Cadiz, Ohio, in 1840 (c).

WIFE: unknown

CHILDREN: unknown

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: William Boggs was found first in Harrison County, Ohio, in Short Creek Township. Later, he moved to Cadiz where he died.

JOHN BRANNON (lived in and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

BORN:April 1744 (a)SON OF:unknownDIED:1835 Harrison County, Ohio (b)AGE:89 years (b & c)BURIED:Old Cadiz Cemetery, Cadiz, Harrison County, Ohio (c)MARKER:Moravian Trail Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution MemorialMARRIED:Yes, but marriage date not known

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private, Continental Line (d)

- **Specific:** John was a private with Capt. Abraham Smith's Co. and Col. William Irvine's Sixth Pennsylvania Regiment of the Continental Line from 25 March 1776 to about January 1777. He was taken prisoner in July 1777 and held in Quebec for five months and eleven days. (e) About a year later he enlisted for three years and served under Capt William Alexander. He was sent home ill in 1780. (e,f) He received a pension starting 11 May 1818. (d)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: John voted in Cadiz Township, Harrison County, Ohio, in October 1813. (h) A John Brannon, fitting his age, resided in Cadiz Village in 1820. (g) Apparently, living with his daughter, Rachel Swigert, in Rumley or North Township at the time of his death. (i)

WIFE: ELIZABETH HABORN (j) <u>BORN</u>: 1755 <u>DIED</u>: 5 April 1821 BURIED: She is buried in Old Cadiz Cemetery. There is no marker.

CHILDREN:

The only known child is Rachel. She was living with them when he applied for the pension. (g) She married Burd Swigert on 30 October 1822. (k)

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: John Brannon's holdings at the time of his pension application were \$19.75 after his debts were subtracted. (e) No record was found of him owning property in Harrison County.

WILLIAM FERGUSON (lived in Washington Co, Pa, & lived & rued in Harrison Co.)

BORN: 1748 (a) <u>SON OF:</u> unknown <u>DIED:</u> 15 December 1832 Harrison County, Ohio (b) <u>AGE:</u> 84 years (b) <u>BURIED:</u> Old Cadiz Cemetery (b) <u>MARKER:</u> Moravian Trail Chapter DAR Memorial in the Old Cadiz Cemetery. <u>MARRIED</u>: unknown

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private in the Washington County, Pa., Militia (c,d,e)

- Specific: William was a private 8th class Capt Samuel Shannon's Company, 3rd Battalion, Washington Co., Pa.(c). In 1782 he was with William Leet's Company against the Upper Sandusky Indians, 1782. (d) Finally, he was a private 8th class, in Captain John Cotton's Co. 3rd Battalion, Washington Co., Pa., Militia returns of 15 September 1782.(e)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: William lived in Washington County, Pennsylvania, until after the end of the war. When he came to Ohio, he lived in Cadiz. (f)

WIFE: No record of a wife found.

CHILDREN: No record of any children found.

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: Unlike several in the frontier militias, he was an active member. He lived in Cadiz and was not, as most of the people of that time, a farmer. As of this time his occupation has not been learned.

ABRAHAM FORNEY (Furney) (lived in Guernsey, Harrison & buried in Harrison Co, Oh)

BORN: ca. 1740 Pennsylvania (a) SON OF: Johan Niclaus and Magdelena Forney (b) DIED: 27 August 1824 Harrison County, Ohio (a) AGE: 84 years (c) BURIED: Old Cadiz Cemetery (d) MARKER: yes MARRIED: no record

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Captain in Pennsylvania militia (d)

- Specific: Abraham Forney was Captain of the 4th company of the 7th Battalion of the York County, Pennsylvania, militia commanded by Lt. Col. Winterode and also, Captain in the 3rd Battalion of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania commanded by Col. Alexander Lowry. His name is spelled several different ways in official records. (d)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: Abraham Forney was born in Pennsylvania. After the war he moved to Frederick County, Maryland, briefly to Guernsey County, Ohio, and then to Cadiz Township, Harrison County, Ohio, where he died. (e)

<u>WIFE:</u> SUSANNA (last name unknown) <u>BORN:</u> 1752 (f) <u>DIED:</u> 28 May 1842 <u>BURIED</u>: Old Cadiz Cemetery (new marker) (f)

CHILDREN:

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: Captain Forney was involved in much of the Revolution. His service started in 1777 and continued until the end of the war. He was a farmer in Cadiz Township. One of his daughters was Mary, who married Charles Timmons.

THOMAS HALEY (lived and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

BORN: either 1746 (a) or 1752 (b) <u>SON OF</u>: unknown <u>DIED</u>: 1832 Cadiz Township, Harrison County, Ohio (c & e) <u>AGE:</u> ca 86 years <u>BURIED</u>: Old Cadiz Cemetery, Harrison County, Ohio (c) <u>MARKER</u>: No marker <u>MARRIED</u>: Yes, but date of marriage unknown

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private, Maryland Continental Line

- Specific: Thomas Haley was enlisted by John E. Howard of Baltimore, Maryland 17 July 1776. He was a member of Captain Lansdale's Company under Col. Josiah Carvell Hall in the 4th Regiment of the Maryland Continental Line from 1776-1778. He was once taken prisoner (g) and was granted a pension in 1818 (d)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: He was in Baltimore County, Maryland when he enlisted. After the War he moved to Harrison County, Ohio. In 1820 a Thomas Haley was living with his wife in Short Creek Township. (f) When he died, he was living with Henry Pepper in Cadiz Township. (e)

WIFE: name unknown

<u>BORN:</u> unknown <u>DIED:</u> Apparently, between 1820 and 1832 in Harrison County, Ohio (e& f) <u>BURIED:</u> Location unknown, but apparently Harrison County (f}

KNOWN CHILDREN:

(1) Joseph (died before his father) (e)

(2)Amy married, last name Griffith (e)

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: It is purely conjecture, but Thomas could have been the son of John and Mary Haley of Prince George County, Maryland. He does not appear on the 1776 with them but would have been with the continental army in August when it was taken.

SAMUEL MAHOLM, SR. (lived and died in Harrison Co, Ohio.)

BORN: November 1758 Lancaster County, Pennsylvania (a) SON OF: unknown DIED: November 1838 Harrison County, Ohio (a) AGE: 80 years (b) BURIED: Old Cadiz Cemetery, Cadiz, Ohio (c) MARKER: No MARRIED: Date of marriage not known

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Lancaster, Pennsylvania (d)

- Specific: In October 1775, Samuel spent 21 days as a private under Captain Morrison. Starting in November 1776 he served two months as a private under Capt. Morrison and Col. Potter. During 1777 he was in the militia for two months as a private under Captain Clark and Col. King. Again in 1781 Samuel Maholm served one month and twelve days under Capt. Clark and Col. Irwin. (d)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: Until about 1806, he lived in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. On 6 May 1806 he received a deed for property then in Jefferson County, Ohio, now in Harrison Co. It is in the current corporation limits of the Village of Cadiz, Ohio (e & f).

<u>WIFE:</u> JANE maiden name unknown (a) <u>BORN</u>: unknown <u>DIED</u>: 20 February 1832 (a) <u>BURIED</u>: Old Cadiz Cemetery, Cadiz, OH (c) There is no marker

CHILDREN: (These are listed on his will.) [g].

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: Samuel was a farmer. The family was members or at least attended the Reformed Presbyterian Church in Cadiz. The Old Cadiz Cemetery was not taken care of adequately for years. Most of the markers were removed since many were broken or fallen. No markers exist for Samuel or Jane.

JOHN McFADDEN (lived and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

BORN: ca. 1746 County Caven, Ireland (a) <u>SON OF</u>: unknown <u>DIED</u>: 13 April 1835 Cadiz Township, Harrison County, Ohio (a & b) <u>AGE</u>: 89 years (b) <u>BURIED</u>: Old Cadiz Cemetery (a) <u>MARKER</u>: Moravian Trail Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution Memorial. <u>MARRIED</u>: ca. 1777 (a)

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private, Washington County, Pa., militia (c)

- Specific: John was a private, 5th class, in Captain George Sharp's company, of the 3rd Battalion of Col. David Williams of the Washington County, Pennsylvania, Militia. On these mentioned records he was with them on 25 September 1781 and 15 April 1782. (c)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: Around the time he was married, he and other family members settled near Buffalo Creek in independence Township, Washington County, Pa. (a) John bought the land and built a log cabin on Section 4, Township 10, Range 5., now in Harrison County, Ohio. This 640 acres was just south of Cadiz and would today include much of Sally Buffalo Park and the fair grounds. Later, he bought the southeast quarter of Section 13 in Athens Township. (d)

WIFE: (a & b) MARGARET SHARP Daughter of Capt. and Mrs. George Sharp of Washington Co., Pa

<u>BORN:</u> 1751 <u>DIED:</u> 26 April 1826 Old Cadiz Cemetery MARKER: No marker still exists for her.

<u>MORE OF HIS LIFE:</u> In 1801 he; his family; his brother, Joseph; and his nephew, John Jamison came to what is now Cadiz Township. On 15 April 1812, John McFadden, one of five trustees appointed by the Associated Reformed Presbyterian Congregation of Cadiz, bought lots 58,59, and 60 for their Union Church. This church appears to have been the first one in Cadiz. The Old Cadiz Cemetery was started by this church. (e)

Descendants of John McFadden still live in Harrison County. The Associated Reformed Church became the United Presbyterian and now has joined with the United Presbyterian Church of U.S.A.

JACOB MEACHEM (from Vermont, lived and died Harrison Co.} <u>BORN:</u> 21August1750 Warren, Massachusetts (a) <u>SON OF:</u> Isaac and Lydia (Blancher) Meachem (a) <u>DIED</u>: November 1813 Cadiz, Harrison County, Ohio (a) <u>AGE</u>: 63 years (b) <u>BURIED</u>: Probably the Old Cadiz Cemetery (a & c) MARRIED: Date not found but the oldest child was born in April 1785, probably 1783 or 1784 (a & d)

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Vermont Continental Army and Militia (a)

- Specific: He served for three months and one week dated 1August1775 with Capt. Abiather Angel's Co., Col. David Brewer's Regiment. In October 1775 he was with Capt. John Wright's Company, David Brewer's Regiment. In 2 November 1777 he was with Capt. Wright's Co., Rufus Putnam's Regiment. (b) Finally, from 21Octto30 October 1781 he was with Capt. Nathaniel Blanchard's Co. militia, in Col Thomas Lee's Regiment at Castleton in Vermont. (a)
- **<u>RESIDED</u>**: Jacob was born in Warren, Massachusetts. He lived In Hinesburgh and Rutland, Vermont. His sons listed here were born in those places. After the War he and his sons moved to Ohio at the same time. (a)

WIFE: MARTHA TUTTLE

BORN & DIED: Martha's birth and death information has not been located. It appears that she was dead prior to her husband and family coming to Ohio. (a)

BURIED: Unknown

CHILDREN:

- (1) Hines Meacham born 1Apr1785 Hinesburgh, Vt. died 5 Jul 1885 Belle Plaine, Scott Co., Minnesota. He married (1st) unknown first name Wetmore, (2nd) Laura Wetmore. (a)

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: After Jacob died, Hines returned to Vermont apparently to settle the estate there. He had purchased a lot in Cadiz. He returned to Ohio after settling the estate but not to Harrison County. Aaron served in Captain Baruch Dickerson's Company from 12 March 1814 to 12 September 1814 for the War of 1812. This company was made up largely of men from Harrison County. He was married in Delaware County, Ohio. (a)

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania Continental Anny (c)

- Specific: He was listed on the pay roll for seven months under Lt. Michael Johnson of the Bedford Pennsylvania Rangers. David Milligan is found also in Captain Boyd's Company of Rangers. (d) He received a pension for his service on 28 October 1833. (c)
