**PETER HOUT** (lived in Virginia and Pennsylvania and lived and died in Jefferson County, Ohio.)

BORN: 18 Feb 1762 in Maryland or Virginia (a)

SON OF: John George & Catherine Hout (Haudt) (a)

DIED: 11 June 1813 Richmond, Jefferson County, Ohio (a).

AGE: 51 years (b)

BURIED: Small marker at Richmond Union Cemetery

MARKER: Metal Marker

MARRIED: 21 November 1786 Berkeley County, Virginia (a)

#### **SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:**

**General**: Private Pennsylvania Line (c)

**Specific**: Peter Hout enlisted as a private on 30 September 1778 for the duration of the war in Capt. John Pearson's Company of the Ninth Pennsylvania Regiment, commanded by Col. Richard Butler. He was paid a bounty of \$120. (c)

**RESIDED**: He was married in Berkeley County, Virginia, but it not clear at this time whether he lived in Virginia or Maryland before he moved to Pennsylvania and then to Ohio. He was in Springfield Township, Jefferson County, Ohio, by 1807. He died in Richmond, Salem Township, Jefferson County, Ohio. (a, d, e)

**SPOUSE**: ROSANNAH MILLER (a)

BORN: 14 September 1765 Berkeley County, Va. (now WVVA).

DIED: 7 August 1822 Richmond, Jefferson County, Ohio.

BURIED: unknown

MARKER: unknown

**MORE OF THE HISTORY**: Peter was a farmer in Jefferson County, Ohio. (a) There is a small metal marker in Richmond Union Cemetery. Since this cemetery appears to have started about forty years after he died, burial at Richmond United Presbyterian Church with other of his descendants may be more logical.
