While these specific pages cannot be used as actual proof of Revolutionary War service, it can be very helpful as a guide. The reference section for each Patriot contains all of the sources used to validate the information presented on this webpage and would be invaluable on a membership application for the Sons or Daughters of the American Revolution.

This cemetery is located in German Township. From Hopedale take County Road 4 (Miller Station Rd) to Miller Station. After crossing the railroad tracks, turn right on Township Road 165 (Blue Ridge Rd). It is about 2 ½ miles from Miller Station Road. The cemetery is about ¼ mile west of Blue Ridge Road.

ADAM HOOBLER (lived and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

BORN: October 1761 (b)

SON OF: unknown

DIED: 27 April 1848 (a)

AGE: 86 years 6 months 27 days (a)

BURIED: Buffalo Hill Cemetery (a)

MARKER: Yes

MARRIED: Yes, exact date is unknown

SERVICES IN REVOLUTION:

General: Private Pennsylvania Line

Specific: Adam was a private in the Pennsylvania Continental Line. He was a prisoner in New York on 19 November 1782. (c)

RESIDED: Adam was living in Harpers Ferry, Virginia (now West Virginia) prior to the Revolutionary War. Following the War, he moved to what is now German Township, Harrison County, Ohio.

WIFE: ELIZABETH LAWYER (d) Assumed to be buried in Buffalo Hill Cemetery (no marker) (no other information)

KNOWN CHILDREN: (Probably, there were others.)

(1) Sarah (born 15 January 1831 - died 18 July 1836 Buffalo Hills) (a)

(2) Magdaline (born 17 Feb 1821) married Joseph Mikesell (d)

MORE OF HIS HISTORY: Adam was a farmer in what is now German Township.
