DANIEL BARE (lived and buried in Harrison County, Ohio.)

BORN: 28 May 1755 York County, Pennsylvania (a)

SON OF: unknown

DIED: 2 November 1831 (b) Rumley Township, Harrison County, Ohio ~:

BURIED: Bare Family Cemetery, Rumley Township NW Quarter of Section 35, Township 10, Range 4 (b)

SERVICE IN THE REVOLUTION:

General: York County, Pennsylvania, Militia (c)

Specific: Daniel Bare was a private in Captain John Sherer's Company, York County, Pennsylvania, Militia in 1782. (c).

RESIDED: He was living in York County, Pa. when he was in service. In May 1810, he was a resident of Somerset County, Pennsylvania (d). As of August 4, 1814 when he purchased his home farm in NW 35-10-4 (e) and when he died, he was in Rumley Township. Harrison Co., Ohio (f).

WIFE: EVA WIIII1MORE (a) daughter of: unknown

Born: 28 December 1760 (a)

Died: 6 November 1848, Age 88 yrs. (b)

Buried: Bare Family Cemetery, Rumley Township.
